“The temple is a great school. It is a house of learning. In the temples the atmosphere is maintained so that it is ideal for instruction in matters that are deeply spiritual. ...Return to learn. Things that have troubled you or things that have been puzzling or things that have been mysterious will become known to you. So look toward the temple. Point your children toward the temple. From the days of their infancy, direct their attention to it, and begin their preparation for the day when they may enter the holy temple. In the meantime, be teachable yourself, be reverent. *(The Holy Temple [pamphlet, 1982], 6–8).*
